Learning Hub Volunteer role

- Support the delivery of the learning programme through pre-booked sessions on St Michael's Mount, Marazion Beach and other mainland estate properties.
- Help to support visits from young people including nurseries, schools, colleges, universities as well as families through pre-booked community groups.
- Welcome international school visits providing a brief overview and orientation of the island.
- Support the delivery of longer-term projects with schools and community groups.
- Accompany the Learning Manager to careers events or outreach projects in schools and community settings.
- Contribute to the development of new learning resources and help maintain existing ones.
- Collaborate with the Learning Manager to reflect and review the programme and devise new ways of engaging learners.

- Interested in Cornish heritage, education and making a difference to the lives of young people.
- Excited about working with children and young people
- Energetic and able to work on a variety of terrains including sand, cobbles, steep paths, battlements and garden terraces.
- Social and keen to engage with a variety of people of different ages and backgrounds.

- Attend occasional briefings to engage with other Learning Hub Volunteers and the Learning Manager.
